Initially, the olives **are harvested** from trees by farmers and **taken** to a washing machine where they **are rinsed** in cold water. The olives **are then transferred** to a grinding machine via a conveyor belt. During this stage, the olive stones **are removed** so that the olives **can be safely ground** into a paste.





Importance of Complex Sentences: They indicate to the examiner that you can use a wide range of error-free structures. This adds to a higher band score.

A complex sentence

It is a sentence that contains an independent clause and one or more dependent clauses. An independent clause can stand alone as a sentence, but a dependent clause even though it has a subject and a verb cannot stand alone.

Examples

- 1. Because I had to catch the train, and as we were short on time, <u>I forgot to pack my toothbrush for our</u> <u>vacation</u>.
- 2. As she was bright and ambitious, she became a manager in no time.

Rules for Formal Writing

- Vocabulary: You must use the right vocabulary. It need not be complex or flowery. It needs to be lucid and contextually appropriate.
- **Punctuation:** You must use appropriate punctuation: commas, dashes, and hyphens, exclamation marks, full stops, question marks, colons, semi-colons.
- Structure: You must write in sentences. Never write in bullet points.
- **The impersonal writer**: You would be expected to write in the first person singular (using the word "I") for task 2.
- **Passive Voice:** Use passive voice only when the goal is to present a set of arguments in an unbiased way. In most cases, use Active Voice. You should aim to write impersonally for academic task 1.



- **Typing and spelling**: All work for submission should be spell-checked and proofread again.
- Abbreviations & contractions: Abbreviations are not used in formal English. They give the impression of a style that is chatty and too informal. "e.g.", "i.e.", "etc.", "can't", "I'm".
- **Capitals**: Proper nouns, names of civic holidays, geographical names, public thoroughfares, important events, trade names, journal titles, and the first letter (only) of book titles.
- Your writing should be **formal and not chatty.** Use appropriate conjunctions and linking words. Instead of "also" or "besides", use "furthermore" or "in addition to". "However" is better than "But".



- Avoid "journalese": Make sure that you have not written work in an exaggerated or sensational style.
- Avoid jargon: Use the jargon of your subject area with accuracy and constraint. Take special care with terms that have specialized meanings in your subject area.
- Avoid redundancy: Contains unnecessary words and is considered grammatically wrong. Example: surrounded on all sides, revert back, postpone until later, etc.
- Avoid filler words: They pad up a sentence without adding meaning. Example: actually, basically, I mean, you know, etc.




